

## **Open Rank Professor of Criminal Justice & Criminology at the University of North Carolina, Charlotte.**

The Department of Criminal Justice and Criminology invites applications for a tenure track open rank professor position beginning August 15, 2017.

**Required qualifications.** Requirements for the position include: (1) a Ph.D. in Criminal Justice or related discipline at the time of appointment; (2) professional credentials commensurate with rank; (3) the ability to teach both undergraduate and graduate courses in the discipline and in the candidate's areas of specialization; (4) interest in and/or experience mentoring graduate students; (5) a commitment to diversity initiatives and expanding diversity and inclusion within the department; and (6) the potential to develop an ongoing research agenda, including the pursuit of extramural funding. Area of specialization is open; candidates interested in Crime Analytics are encouraged to apply. Finalists will be asked during their screening interview to discuss how the topics of diversity and inclusion are incorporated into their teaching and research.

**The Department:** The consists of fourteen tenure-track faculty members and four fulltime lecturers. B.A. and M.S. degrees are offered in Criminal Justice & Criminology and the Department contributes to the Interdisciplinary Ph.D. Program in Public Policy and the Data Science and Business Analytics Program.
