MINOR IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE & CRIMINOLOGY (CJUS)

To complete the CJUS minor, students must complete **18 hours** of criminal justice coursework. This includes **6 hours** of required courses (CJUS 1100 and 2340) plus **12 hours** of CJUS electives (6 of these 12 hours must be at the 3000 level or higher). An overall GPA of 2.0 in the minor courses is needed to graduate.

NOTES: CJUS 1100 is a **pre-requisite** for all CJUS minor coursework.

REQUIRED COURSEWORK: Six (6) hours of required coursework are needed to complete the minor. All required coursework below must be completed with a grade of **C or better**. Students may attempt each required CJUS course no more than 2 times, including all Withdraw and grade replacements of D or F. Students will be restricted from enrolling in these CJUS classes a 3rd time.

Students will be restricted from enrolling in CJUS 2340 a 3rd time. Additional elective courses are listed on the back.

Procedure to Declare the CJUS Minor

1. Complete the requirements for the minor, which are:
 - Must have a declared major other than Pre-CJ or CJUS
 - A minimum undergraduate GPA of 2.0 **and** a minimum GPA of 2.0 in all CJUS coursework must appear on your transcript at the time you declare
